

American Junior Brahman Association Scholarship Application

The American Junior Brahman Association is pleased to support youth through the building of education, personal development and team working skills. Along with this effort, AJBA and other associated scholarships will offer scholarships to young people who have shown outstanding contributions to agriculture and the Brahman industry. These scholarships will be broken into three \$1,000 awards and will be given to the most qualified applicants annually during the "All American" National Junior Brahman Show.

Procedures:

Applications should be returned to the ABBA Office no later than **June 1** of the application year. Upon receipt, the applications will be reviewed by a committee comprised of four evaluators.

A check will be awarded to the winner after he/she presents evidence of enrollment as a full-time student in accordance with guidelines. In the event that the winner of a scholarship fails to meet the enrollment requirements by September 30th the award will be forfeited. Should the recipient fail to complete at least one semester of full time enrollment in an accredited or approved institution the award will be forfeited.

Qualifications:

1. Applicants must be an active member of the American Junior Brahman Association.
2. Applicants must be a high school graduating senior in the year the application is submitted.
3. Scholarship is to be presented to the recipient upon proof of enrollment to a college or university.
4. Application Deadline is **June 1** of the year the scholarship is to be presented.

Instructions:

All scholarship applications should be typewritten. Pages may be added to the scholarship form if needed and should directly follow the page in which the question appears. Staple the application before mailing to assure the pages stay in order.

Official high school transcripts must accompany the AJBA scholarship application to emphasize the applicant's academic career.

Your application must include three letters of recommendation. The letters should include your association with the individual writing the recommendation along with a candid evaluation of your abilities, background, character, strengths, etc. The recommendation may come from employers, teachers, ag lenders, junior advisors, pastors, etc. They may not include parents or American Brahman Breeders Association employees. The letters of recommendation should be submitted with the scholarship application thus these should be completed as early as possible.

June 1 is the absolute deadline for mailing all applications. Faxed copies will not be accepted! Note: With regard to this deadline, materials mailed must be postmarked by the U.S. Postal Service on or before **June 1**.

For applications to be eligible for review, it must include:

1. Complete and signed application
2. Three letters of recommendation
3. An official high school transcript
4. Postmarked by June 1 of the application year
5. ACT Score
6. SAT Score
